What is The BAMA Standard?

From design to disposal, The BAMA Standard:

- Sets out in 9 Modules clear requirements on how to deal with well defined issues
- Promotes a philosophy of continual improvement
- Provides a self-assessment methodology to identify strengths and weaknesses and decide where to make improvements
- Provides a means to identify companies operating to good manufacturing practice
- Provides a focus for industry-specific training

What are the Modules?

- 1 Product Design
- 2 Supply of Components and Raw Materials
- 3 Manufacturing
- 4 Consumer Labelling and Provision of Information
- 5 Transport of Aerosols (Packaging & Labelling)
- 6 Warehousing of Aerosols
- 7 Disposal of Full and Part-Full Aerosols
- 8 Planning for an Emergency
- 9 Product Recall and Consumer Returns

How does it Work?

Each Module consists of two parts:

- Requirements and Guidance
- Self-Assessment Checklist and Assessors' Guidance

Requirements & guidance

Requirements set out in precise language

- Good Practice – must do
- Best Practice – aid to continuous improvement

Guidance gives

- Supporting information to explain requirements
- Advice on achieving requirements

The BAMA Standard was written by groups of experts in BAMA and incorporates the combined knowledge and expertise of the entire aerosol supply chain
